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Job Flight from Worcester

Since 2002, the Worcester Regional Airport has seen consistent declines in business. Once the home of Delta, US Airways, American Eagle, and Pan Am, the airport now hosts no commercial airlines. US Airways ended service in March of 2003; the other airlines ended service in 2002. Today, general aviation, corporate, small and large aircraft charter, private flights, and training flights through the Amity Flight School are the only flights in Worcester. Below is a summary of the economic impact of job losses as a result of loss of commercial airline service at the Airport. The City, airlines, rental car services, Hudson News, the Federal Transportation Security Administration (TSA), and Swissport, the Airport's Fixed Base Operator (FBO) employed over 160 people in Worcester and added over \$4 million to the local economy through salaries. Today, the Airport is home to 42 jobs worth approximately \$1.7 million in annual salaries—a 75% loss of jobs and a 62% loss in salaries. Some businesses continue to operate at the Airport in the absence of commercial flights. However, all of these businesses have experienced changes since the end of commercial flights out of Worcester, and all (with the exception of the flight school) have had to eliminate jobs as a result. The loss of commercial air service has had a significant adverse economic impact on the City that is equivalent to the loss of a mid-size business.
