#### What is ComNET?

## Computerized Neighborhood Environment Tracking

A systematic process to record the physical conditions in your neighborhood that may require attention.



### What's changed since ComNET began?

- Citywide, more than 12,700 problem conditions documented since 2001
  - 57 surveys in 13 neighborhoods
- Seven out of 10 (69%) of previously documented problems have been resolved
- City and community use data to identify and quantify problems
- Developed proactive approaches to dealing with problems- something getsdone



### **ComNET Results: Quinsigamond Village**

- ❖ Initial survey conducted in Summer 2002
- Due to large geographic area, added "Quinsigamond Village South" survey in 2003 (also re-survey of Quinsigamond Village)
  - Follow-up surveys in both areas in 2005 & 2006



## Quinsigamond Village (North) Overall Results

- ❖ 709 total problem conditions have been identified since 2002
- ❖ Over 2/3 (70%) of all problems were street and sidewalk issues
- Problems are grouped according to whose responsibility it is to address the issue
  - ■72% of the problems identified are the responsibility of the Department of Public Works + Parks
  - ■17% of problems are "community issues"



## Quinsigamond Village South Overall Results

- **❖221 total problem conditions have been identified since 2003**
- ❖Almost 2/3 (64%) of all problems were street and sidewalk issues
- ❖Problems are grouped according to whose responsibility it is to address the issue
  - 72% of the problems identified are the responsibility of the Department of Public Works + Parks
  - 16% of problems fall under the responsibility of Code Enforcement
  - 11% of problems are "community issues"



## Quinsigamond Village Overall Results Cont'd

- **❖Quinsigamond Village:** More than half (56%) of previously identified problems have been resolved
- Quinsigamond Village South: One-third of previously identified problems have been resolved

Examples of resolved problems include:

- 54 Sites with litter
- 34 Sites with overgrown weeds/vegetation
- 12 Dumping sites



- 24 Trip hazards
- 16 Abandoned vehicles

#### 197 Problems Resolved Recently

- **❖Problems resolved since last survey in 2005:** 
  - 32 Sites with litter
  - ■10 Sidewalk trip hazards
  - 10 Abandoned vehicles
  - 41 Locations with dirt/sand
  - 14 Clogged catch basins/sewers
  - •11 Sites with potholes/uneven road




#### **565 Problems Remain**

#### **❖**Examples include:

- 42 Locations with litter
- 11 Dumping sites
- 64 Locations with dirt/sand
- ■73 Sites with overgrown weeds/vegetation
- 15 Abandoned vehicles
- 58 Sites with potholes/uneven road
- 76 Sidewalk trip hazards




#### 565 Remaining Problems: Who Is Responsible?

## **What Happens Next?**

- ❖ All of the problems recorded that are the responsibility of a City agency will be shared with the appropriate agency, including specific details about each problem and its location.
- The City then determines how the problems will be addressed. Some of these problems will be addressed more quickly than others.

# Addressing neighborhood problems: Where do we begin?

- Prioritize problems and be realistic you won't solve everything at once!
  - •What's most important to residents?
  - •What resources are necessary to resolve problems?
  - •Who else do you need to engage? How?
  - Map out a plan assigning roles, responsibilities, timeline, etc. and keep track of progress.
